From The Pastor

After recently performing a wedding, I was joking around with a friend that I had the easy part, that was performing the ceremony. Now the challenging aspect of making the marriage work was up to the couple, of course with God's help & grace. My friend made an interesting statement. He said, "the couple has the heavy lifting to do, and a sprinkling of divine intervention along the way will lighten the load." Surely any heavenly "intervention" would be helpful. But just a sprinkling? If you have been married for any time at all you know a

sprinkling just won't do. Your marriage had better be immersed with the presence of God if you stand a chance of making it. That goes for every aspect of life, doesn't it? It's unfortunate to see so many Christians settle for a sprinkling of God upon their lives-they will attend a church service, hum along with the music, drop a dollar or two in the offering plate, go their way and never even get in the vicinity of God's Word all during the following week. Then when the bottom drops out and comforts are gone and anxiety rises, they get angry at God. I plead with you as your pastor and friend to make time daily for a fresh intake of the Word of God. For several months in this column we looked together at the passage in Philippians 4:8 (please look it up-I don't have space here to quote it). What I will refer to is a portion of verse 9 where Paul said that as a result of Godly thinking, learned from him, then put into practice in their lives, that, "...the God of peace will be with you." Turn to the Scriptures starting today. Think hard about what you are reading. Internalize it into your heart. Ask God how this passage applies to your life, and obey without hesitation. It's going to take more than a sprinkling. It's going to take steady downpour of God's Word upon our hearts. The result-an experience of the peace of God, unlike anything this world can offer, healthy spiritual living, and a consistent testimony of God's grace & power to a watching world. Don't settle for a sprinkling. God has so much more to offer you. Will you let Him show you? I pray you will.
